The applicant Smt. Tilaki, who is Widow of Late Shri Ram Singar, Railway Carriage Fitter posted at Bhatni, who died in Harness on 10.1.82 in N.E. Railway Hospital, Gorakhpur has prayed that her only issue i.e her daughter Smt. Vidyawati Yadava, who has passed her Intermediate examination in 1984 and whose date of birth is 01.3.1966 may be provided with a job on Compassionate Ground, as she is the only supporting member for her family.

2. The prayer of the applicant was rejected on 20.10.87 vide (Annexure A-1) by the respondents on the ground that there is no provision to appoint a married daughter on compassionate ground.

3. The learned counsel for the applicant submitted, that on the strength of Railway Board decision, contained in the letter dated 30.4.89, that there is no such instructions imposed by the Railway Board, in making the appointment of the married daughter on compassionate ground.

4. Sri Praahant Mathur ^{learned Counsel} appearing on behalf of the respondents and submits that there is no provision in the Railways to provide a job on compassionate ground to a married daughter of the deceased Railway Employee and, as such he submitted that there ^{could not} be a blank cheque to provide job on compassionate grounds.

It appears that the respondents have not considered the prayer of the applicant in right perspectives and, as such, the respondents are directed to consider her ^{fresh} case for providing a job to her daughter i.e. Smt Vidya-^{Wati} Yadava, ^{on compassionate grounds,} if it is possible as per rules of the Railway, within three months of the receipt of this order. The application is disposed of with these observations.
