The applicant, who was engaged as Volunteer Ticket Collector in N.E.Railway, has approached this tribunal seeking a direction to the respondents for re-engagement and thereafter to regularise him in view of the Railway Board Circular dated 6.2.90.

2. According to the applicant, he was engaged as Volunteer Ticket Collector w.e.f. 3.3.84 and worked for 222 days. He has also annexed the copy of service certificate given to him by the Railway Administration (Annexure-A1).

3. The respondents in their counter affidavit have taken stand that the scheme, prepared by the Railway Administration for engagement of Ex.Mobile Booking Clerk in compliance of the judgment of the Principal Bench of the Tribunal in Neera Mehta's case, will not apply to the case of Volunteer Ticket Collector. Hence the applicant is not entitled for the relief prayed for.

4. Similar matters came before a Bench consisting of one of us (Hon'ble Mr. K.Obayya,A.M.) in O.A. 136 of 1992 and bunch cases relating Volunteer Ticket Collector. In those cases a direction was given to the Railway Administration to prepare a scheme for voluntary Ticket Collector and to re-engage them and to regularis

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Direction was also given to the effect that ' the scheme be framed within a period of two months from the date of communication of this order.' The direction issued in those cases will apply squarely to this case also and the respondents are directed to extend the benefit of the scheme prepared by them for Volunteer Ticket Collectors to the applicant and re-engage him and regularise his services in accordance with the terms of the scheme so prepared. With the above directions, the application stands disposed of. No order as to costs.
