**ORDER**

The applicant has filed this application seeking a direction to the respondents to appoint him either in the vacancy of Lower Division Clerk or in the vacancy of Meter Reader on compassionate grounds.

2. I have heard Ms.Viji for the applicant and Mrs.Jisha for the respondents. I have also perused the entire proceedings of the case.

3. Respondents in their reply statement submitted that the applicant was considered for appointment on compassionate grounds both for the posts of L.D.C and Meter Reader. However, the position of the applicant in the merit list was very low and there were only very limited number of posts available for appointment against the compassionate ground quota.

4. After having convinced about the above factual position the applicant's counsel has fairly not pressed for the reliefs sought in this application. In the above facts and circumstances of the case, being devoid of any merit, this O.A is dismissed. There shall be no order as to costs.
