**ORDER**


**HON'BLE MRS.SATHI NAIR, VICE CHAIRMAN**

The applicant is seeking an compassionate appointment in the Postal Department as her father expired on 31.7.2001 while he was working as Sub Post Master at Payyanamon, near Konni. Her case was rejected by Annexure A-1 order dated 1.2.2002 stating that it was not covered under the guidelines. Subsequently the applicant had submitted representations for which the same reply has been received in the year 2003. The applicant then filed Review Petition before the 1<sup>st</sup> respondent
