



After the applicant retired from service, he has been engaged to act as inquiry officer for conducting disciplinary proceedings. The order of appointment is dated 12th January, 1990 as at Annexure A2. By the said order, ~~the~~ services of the applicant as inquiry officer have been engaged on terms mentioned therein. He has not been employed with the respondents. In the circumstances, we find that the challenge to the order of 7th September 1999 removing his name from the

panel of inquiry officers does not constitute a service matter as defined under section 2 (9) of the Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985. The Tribunal, therefore, has no jurisdiction to entertain and try the present OA. Present OA, in the circumstances, is dismissed. No order as to costs.
