d. Subject in brief :-

The applicants are praying for declaration that they are entitled to be promoted for higher cadres in service as Fitters along with the persons from Electrical Wing from the date of their initial appointment with all consequential benefits based on the seniority.

4. Jurisdiction of the Tribunal :

The applicant declares that the subject matter of relief which he wants is within the jurisdiction of the Tribunal under Section 14 of the Tribunal.

5. Limitation :-

The applicant further declares that the application is within the period of limitation prescribed under Section 21 of the Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985.

6. FACTS OF THE CASE :-

The applicants submit that the Electrical Loco-Shed at Vijayawada was started in the year 1979. In the said Loco-Shed there are two wings - viz., Mechanical and Electrical.

The applicants have worked in the South Central Railway at various places as "Kalasis" and "Kalasi Helpers". Subsequently they were appointed as "Fitters". The applicants submit that the Fitters post has three categories - Grade-III, Grade-II and Grade-I. Fitter Grade-III falls above the category of Kalasi Helpers. The applicants submit that there is 25% quota for serving employees. Under this 25% quota some of the applicants have been promoted to Grade-III Fitters from Kalasi Helpers. However, the respondents also appointed other persons including some of the applicants herein directly as Grade-III Fitters. Grade-III Fitters under both the wings i.e., Electrical and Mechanical are appointed through a notification issued by the respondents. Accordingly the persons whoever are interested may chose the respective field that is Electrical or Mechanical according to one's own interest. Accordingly they will be called for a written test and if one passes through the test, he will be considered for appointment under the said wing. The applicants are Fitters working in the Mechanical Wing. The grievance of the applicants is that the persons who are given appointment in the Electrical Wing are being promoted to Grade-II Fitters and Grade-I Fitters much before the Mechanical Staff. The applicants submit that it is unfortunate that the Mechanical Staff are being left behind in Category-III while their contemporaries in Category III of Electrical Wing are being promoted to Category-II and Category I respectively. This is because of the present policy of 60:40 ratio.

The applicants submit that in the year 1979 when the Loco Shed was started at Vijayawada about 80 persons were absorbed as Electrical Fitters and out of these 80 persons about 20 persons were treated as "Mechanical Fitters". In

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the year 1980 about 50 persons were taken as Mechanical Fitters. Consequently the 20 persons who were treated as Mechanical Fitters out of the Electrical Fitters have become seniors to these 50 persons.

The applicants submit that there is another category called "ARTISAN CATEGORY" in the said loco-shed. The said Artisan Category workers are the skilled workers namely - Machinists, Turners, Welders, Painters, Drivers, Gas-Cutters, Carpenters etc. The various categories of workers in the above shed are as follows :

1. Kalasi ;
2. Kalasi Helper as Basic Fitter ;
3. Fitter Grade - III
4. Fitter Grade - II (Promotion/Feeder Post from Fitter Grade-III)
5. Fitter Grade - I

The applicants submit that the Divisional Railway Manager - 2nd respondent has recruited about 80 persons vide Employment Notice No.B/P. 563/11 TRS dated 7-12-1979 as Grade-III Electrical Fitters. By the Proceedings dated 11-4-84 The Divisional Personnel Officer (Personnel Branch), Vijayawada in Memo No.B/P 671/II/TRS ^{A-VI} about 12 persons of this Grade-III personnel were converted as Mechanical Fitters. In the month of April, 1984 all these 80 persons were promoted to Grade-II Fitters. These include the 12 persons who were converted as Mechanical Fitters just before the promotion to Grade-II. The applicants submit that these 12 persons are included in the Mechanical Wing were promoted to Grade-II Cadre on par with the Electrical staff. Thus restricting the chances of other Mechanical Staff of their promotion. The applicants submit

that the Mechanical staff at present are not being promoted along with the Electrical Staff to the higher cadres. The applicants submit that vide proceedings dated 15-09-1980 in No.B/P.563/II/Traction of the Divisional Railway Manager (Personnel) Office, recruitment/selection was conducted for recruiting Artisans of Traction Rolling Stock and TRD organisations from serving employees in Class-IV Categories i.e., like semi-skilled, unskilled and substitutes/casual labour working in Railway Electrification Project as well as in open line. Under the said proceedings 23 persons were taken as Welders, Machinists, Turners and about 21 persons were taken as General Fitters and 10 others were taken as Diesel/Tractor/Motor Mechanics. The applicants submit that in the year 1984 these persons were promoted to Grade-II Fitters cadre. The applicants submit that about 23 persons of the Artisan Staff have been included in the seniority list of Mechanical Staff and were promoted to Grade-II in the year 1984. The applicants submit that as a result of the inclusion of the Artisan Staff in the seniority list of Mechanical Fitters the chances of the other Mechanical Fitters for the promotion to Category-II have become bleak. The applicants submit that some of the applicants were appointed as Fitters Grade-III in the year 1983 along with others. In the year 1987 the persons who were appointed under the Electrical Wing were promoted to Grade-II, whereas the persons under the Mechanical Wing remained to be in Grade-III till 1988. For instance the applicant No.1 who was appointed as Fitter Grade-III in 1983 along with 3 others who were appointed as Electrical Fitters. He was promoted to Grade-II post in the year 1988 whereas the Electrical Fitters under Grade-III were promoted to Grade-II in the year 1987. The applicants submit that the Fitters under Mechanical Wing are not being promoted along with the Fitters under the Electrical Wing and no reasons were assigned by the respondents inspite of their several requests made to them.

The applicants submit that Junior Electrical Staff are getting promotions whereas the Senior Mechanical Staff are unable to get promotions. This resulting in grave injustice and agony to the applicants.

The applicants submit that the 'Kalasis' are asked to opt while being promoted to post of 'Kalasi Helpers'. Thereafter they are required to be promoted to the post of Grade-III Fitter in the respective wings. Those who have opted for Electrical Wing were able to progress and were being promoted to higher cadres, while the chances are becoming restrictive for the persons in the Mechanical Wing. To overcome this situation the Personnel Branch, Headquarters Office St Secunderabad vide Proceedings No.P.(EL)694/Sengh/LXIII/Sub.14 dated 23-10-1991 A-17 has taken a decision in consultation with the Chief Electrical Engineer that in future while filling up of Artisan Posts of Grade-III of different trades whether under Mechanical or Electrical Wing the Kalasi Helpers in grade Rs.800-1500 irrespective of their trade on which they are assigned i.e., Electrical or Mechanical will be trade-tested for suitability, for promotion, irrespective of the post of Artisan Grade-III according to their seniority and availability of the vacancies in the respective wings. The applicants submit that under this revised policy now there is no differentiation between the Electrical Kalasis and Mechanical Kalasis. Both will be considered together basing on their seniority for Grade-III Fitter in the respective wings. The applicants submit that persons who are taken in the Electrical Wing are being promoted to Grade-II from Grade-III much before the persons from the Mechanical Wing. The ratio of promotions is 60 : 40. Under this ratio Mechanical Staff will naturally be denied the promotion along with the Electrical Staff as the ratio application ~~is~~ is more to Electrical Staff than the Mechanical Staff. The applicants submit that a representation dated 1-1-1991 A-IV was

given to the Divisional Railway Manager (Personnel) bringing this fact to his notice requesting him to consider the ratio of promotion to 50 : 50 instead of 60 : 40 as the work loan under the Mechanical Work is being increased day-by-day. The list of various works under the Mechanical Wing wherein the applicants are attending to is filed as a material paper, which may be read as a part of this application for better appreciation of the facts of the case.

By considering the above various types of works, the respondents have to consider the case of the applicants for promotion to Fitter Grade-III to Fitter Grade-II, Fitter Grade-II to Fitter Grade-I on par with the Electrical Staff. The applicants submit that the loco-shed Vijayawada has the following sanctioned and existing strength respectively for various posts.

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The applicants submit that some persons who were appointed under the Artisan Category have been converted into Mechanical Fitters inspite of the posts available in various types in Artisan Category thus depriving the Mechanical Fitters of their promotional chances in the year 1984. Those who are converted as Mechanical Fitters from the Artisan Category will naturally become seniors to the Mechanical Staff. Thus depriving the Mechanical Staff of their fair chances of promotions to higher grades.

The applicants submit that the revised policy taken by the respondent dated 23-10-1991 for filling up of the Kalasi and Kalasi Helpers is a healthy decision and the respondent ought to have taken the same policy even for the promotions of Grade-III Fitters to Grade-II and Grade-I of Mechanical along with the staff of the Electrical Wing. However, they have not done so. The applicants submit that the revised policy taken for the Kalasi Helpers under the Mechanical Wing has given an equal opportunity now for the appointment to Grade-III Fitters along with Kalasi Helpers under the Electrical Wing. However, from Grade-III to higher cadres the policy is not 50:50 but 60:40.

The applicants submit that the work load in the Mechanical Wing at the Vijayawada Loco-shed is increased, of late as UAG I and UAG 5-A type Locos that is the old Locos are being sent from other Divisional Railways to Vijayawada for rectification. The same are being ~~xxxx~~ rectified by the applicants along with others and the said Locos are put to use. The said locos are being used to passenger trains and goods trains. Though the track is electrified the Mechanical modification is more in the shed before the locos are run on the electric track. It is also pertinent to state that the recruitment is itself is arbitrary because recruitment of Electrical Staff is more than the Mechanical Staff. They are not taken equally. Though the work load in Mechanical wing is more compared to Electrical Work.

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The applicants submit that the Divisional Manager (Railway) issued proceedings dated 4-12-1991^{A-11} for filling up of the vacancies of Artisans Grade-I & Grade-II in Electrical and in Mechanical Wings. Pursuant to this notification the said vacancies will be filled according to the present ratio. Under the present policy the number of persons to be promoted is less than the persons to be promoted from the Electrical Wing. The applicants submit that subsequently the Divisional Railway Manager by proceedings dated 29-1-1992^{A-11} issued directions to the Chief Personnel Manager, Vijayawada has fixed the dates of trade test in order to fill up all the vacancies in Artisan Grade-I and Grade-II in Electrical and Mechanical Wing. The Trade Tests are going to be conducted for the said posts from 3-2-1992 and 18-2-1992. If the respondents are allowed to proceed with the filling up of the vacancies without ~~changing~~ changing the ratio of promotion from 60:40 to 50:50, great injustice and hardship would be caused to the applicants. As stated supra, the respondents have changed the policy of recruitment by making it 50:50 for the posts of Kalasi Helpers. However, the same has not been done in the case of Fitters Grade-III. In the said circumstances filling up of the vacancies in 60:40 ratio is also in violation of Article 14 and 16 of the Constitution of India apart from being unfair and arbitrary. If the respondents are allowed to proceed to fill up the vacancies in the Trade Tests which are going to be held ~~on~~ from 3-2-1992 to 18-2-1992, the very purpose of filing this Original Application will be defeated.

7. Details of remedies exhausted :-

The applicants submit that they have no other effective alternative remedy except to approach this Hon'ble Tribunal for relief.

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8. Matter not pending with any other Court etc.:

The applicants declare that they have not filed any other representation or suit etc. before any other judicial forum leading to the same cause of action.

9. Relief sought for :

i) Under the said circumstances the applicants most respectfully pray that the Hon'ble Tribunal may be pleased to pass an order or direction declaring that the applicants are entitled for promotions to higher cadres along with the Fitters under the Electrical Wing from Grade-III to Grade-II and Grade-II to Grade-I based on their respective seniority or in the alternative fix the promotion policy in the ratio of 50:50 by excluding the Artisan category from the Mechanical Wing under the seniority list. The applicants submit that the respondents are going ahead to conduct the Trade Test for the appointment of Fitters under both the wings for Grade-II and Grade-I from Grade-III vide proceedings dated 4-12-91 and 29-01-1992. If the ~~applicants~~ respondents are allowed to proceed to conduct the tests, the applicants pray that injustice will be caused to the applicants ; and

ii) grant such other relief or reliefs as this Hon'ble Tribunal deems fit and proper, in the circumstances of the case.

10. INTERIM RELIEF :-

For the reasons and circumstances stated supra, the Hon'ble Tribunal may be pleased to direct the respondents not to proceed to conduct the Trade Test in pursuance of the proceedings dated 4-12-1991 and 29-1-1992 pending final decision on the O.A. and pass such other order or orders as are deemed fit and proper in the circumstances of the case.







Khalasis and Khalasi Helpers of artisan category are required to be trade-tested on seniority-cum-suitability for promotion to various trades of the skilled artisan posts Grade III in scale Rs.950-1500.

2. In the Electrical Loco Shed there are two wings viz., Mechanical and Electrical. The different trades of artisan posts of Mechanical wing are distinct from Electrical Wing. Therefore there has been a practice in that the Khalasis are asked to opt while being promoted to the post of Khalasi Helper in scale Rs.800-1150. Thereafter they are required to be promoted to skilled artisan posts Gr.III in the respective wings viz., Mechanical and Electrical. This has caused a situation in that those who have opted for Electrical wing were able to progress while the chances are restrictive in the Mechanical wing.

3. In order to overcome this situation in future, it has been decided, in consultation with the Chief Electrical Engineer, that in future while filling up the vacancies of artisan posts Gr.III of different trades whether in Mechanical wing or Electrical wing, the Khalasi Helpers in grade Rs.800-1500 irrespective of their trade on which they are assigned, will be trade-tested for suitability for promotion to the respective trade of the post of artisan Gr.III. In case anyone is unwilling in writing, he will be by passed so that the juniors can be considered. In other words, there will be no water tight compartment hence forth in the grade of Khalasi Helpers for their future avenue. Consequently, the options exercised by the Khalasis/Khalasi Helpers in the past if any, will be invalid in future. Therefore Khalasis when they are being promoted to the post of Khalasi Helpers, as and when arise, they will be considered only on the basis of seniority-cum-suitability and unsuitable candidates will be passed over. There will be no options to be exercised henceforth.

4. The above revised policy will be in vogue for the future vacancies in the categories of Khalasi Helpers and artisan posts Gr.III and the promotions so far effected as per the prevailing practice, will remain unchanged so that the new procedure will not affect the seniority of the persons so promoted.

We the following Mechanical Artisan Staff of Electrical Loco Shed, Vijayawada would like to bring the following few lines for your kind consideration and sympathetic action please.

The Electrical Loco Shed/Vijayawada was started in 1981. At that time the Mechanical Work in ~~the~~ Electrical Loco Shed was less. Hence at that time while forming the avenue chart both recognised Unions have agreed to the ratio of 60:40 for Electrical and Mechanical cadres respectively. But presently the situation was entirely changed. Now the mechanical staff are attending works of mainly total for the Locos -- WAM₄ - 39 Nos., WAG 5 A - 26 Nos. WAG₁ - 50 Nos, and WAG₄ - 13 Nos. Locos (Total 128 Locos), which locos mechanical part of work is more than electrical side work. But since as per the present avenue chart 60:40 ratio mechanical staff are denied of promotion because of lack of mechanical posts. Junior Electrical Staff are getting promotions, whereas the senior mechanical staff are unable to get promotion. In this way, the mechanical staff are in a depressed and worried stage and are not happy. In this connection we would like to give the actual works performed by the mechanical staff in Electrical Loco Shed/Vijayawada for the present existing 128 Locos.

COUNTER AFFIDAVIT FILED ON BEHALF OF THE RESPONDENTS.

I, B.V.A.Krishnamurthy, Son of late B. Subba Rao aged about 56 years, Occupation: Sr.DEE/TRS, South Central Railway resident of Vijayawada do hereby solemnly and sincerely affirm and state as follows:-

1. I am the Sr.Divisional Electrical Engineer, Traction Rolling Stock, South Central Railway, Vijayawada and I am the 3rd respondent herein, as such I am well acquainted with the facts of the case. I am filing this counter-affidavit on my behalf and on behalf of respondents herein, as I am authorised to do so.
2. I submit that I have read the O.A. of the applicants herein, I respectfully submit that it is replete with incorrect inconsistent and at variance with the following History of the case should be deemed as denied and I deny the various allegations made therein except those that are specifically admitted by me hereunder.
3. In reply to para 6(1), it is submitted that the Electrical Loco Shed comes under Traction Rolling Stock Department. The staff employed in Railway are programmed to progress by having a scheme of distribution of posts in different grades at a particular percentage and an avenue. This avenue is finalised by the Administration in consultation with the representation of the Organised Labour (2 recognised Trade Unions) at the Zonal level by Headquarters of South Central Railway. As per the existing avenue chart, there are two wings, of which one is Mechanical wing

and the other is Electrical Wing. With a view to provide the Administration requisite quantity and quality of staff in take to the skilled grade the following arrangement is made. The unskilled staff are promoted to the semi-skilled and semi-skilled to skilled to the extent of 50% of the skilled grade basing on seniority-cum-suitability. 25% of the skilled is filled by conducting Limited Departmental Competitive Examination by affording opportunity to the more talented qualified staff. 25% direct recruitment by lateral induction. Accordingly, on both the wings the vacancies of Fitters are filled by promotion (50%) from Khalasi Helpers and 25% by LDCE quota from serving Khalasis and Khalasi Helpers and 25% by Direct Recruitment. As per that some of the applicants have come to Fitters Gr.III cadre under Direct Recruitment in 1979 and 1980 when direct recruitment was made at the initial stages of formation of the Electrical Loco Shed. Some of the applicants have been promoted from Khalasi Helpers and from LDCE quota. At the time of appointment as Gr.III Fitters, the candidates have the choice to choose by exercising an option the wing in which they are interested viz., Mechanical and Electrical and after passing the necessary trade tests they were appointed as Mechanical and Electrical Fitters as per their choice. These Fitters are eligible for promotion in their respective wings as Gr.II and Gr.I. To ensure that the promotional prospects of these staff are not affected by Rly.Board orders that the distribution of posts be made into skilled Gr.III, ^{Skilled Gr.III} Skilled Gr.I and also stipulated that this distribution be made at the ratio of 30:35:35: respectively. As per the working needs of the Electrical Loco Shed, the posts created for the Mechanical Wing are less than that of the Electrical wing and they are in the ratio of 40:60 respectively. Due to this, the posts in higher grades of Fitter/Gr.II and Gr.I in the Mechanical wing are less compared to the grades of I & II in the Electrical wing numerically but percentage is same thus not affecting the equality. Due to this, Fitters in Gr.III working in the Mechanical Wing are getting less No. of promotions numerically when compared to the Electrical Fitters.

4) In reply to para 6(2), it is submitted that as stated in the above para, the intake of the Mechanical Fitters is less than the Electrical Fitters in 1979 and 1980 as per the working needs basing on the technical requirements of the Electrical Loco Shed.

5) In reply to para 6(3). It is submitted there are other categories of artisans in Electrical Loco Shed as Mechanists, Turners, Welders, Drivers, Lorry Drivers etc., who were employed as per the working needs of the shed for the upkeep and maintenance of Electrical Locos. Some of these categories which are akin to the main wings of Mechanical and Electrical are clubbed with respective wings for the purpose of avenue of promotion. As such, the category of Mechinist, Weld Turner etc., are bracketed with Mechanical Fitters and Crane Drivers and Crane Operators are bracketed with Electrical Fitters. The following categories of employees are working in the Shed.

- i) Khalasis in scale. .. Rs.750-940(RSRP)
- ii) Khalasi Helpers in scale.. Rs.800-1150(RSRP)
- iii) Fitters/Gr.III in scale .. Rs.950-1500(RSRP)
- iv) Fitters/Gr. II in scale .. Rs.1200-1800(RSRP)
- v) Fitters/Gr.I in scale .. Rs.1320-2040(RSRP)

The first two grades (viz.) Khalasis and Khalasi Helpers are common for both the Mechanical and Electrical wings. They will assist the Fitters/Gr.III and higher grade Fitters in their day-to-day working since they are unskilled or semi-skilled and they will ~~xxxx~~ come under Group 'D' category of staff. From Fitters Gr.III, the channels are bifurcated into two Branches as Mechanical and Electrical Fitters/Gr.III will progress to Gr.II and Gr.I basing on their suitability and availability of the vacancies.

6) In reply to para 6 (4), it is submitted that as already mentioned above, the various categories of staff at the time of recruitment viz.) as Khalasis and Fitters/Gr.III where they are initially recruited will be taken as per the working needs



of the Traction Rolling Stock Organisation. The various categories of posts are also created as per the working needs of the Shed. The Mechanist etc., who were recruited as per the working trades are allied to the Mechanical wing. The seniority of the employees belonging to allied trades is clubbed with the Mechanical Fitters for the purpose of promotion. The seniors among them will be promoted to Gr.II as per the combined seniority after passing the necessary trade test.

The applicants cannot compare themselves with that of the employees of the other Electrical wing with regard to their promotions, since the No. of posts as well as employees are more in the Electrical wing than that of the Mechanical wing and Principle of equality is not deviated. The promotions in the Electrical wing will be more than Mechanical wing since the higher grade posts are proportionately more, because the posts are bifurcated from Gr.III to Gr.I on a percentage basis. The seniority of the staff is separately maintained for Electrical and Mechanical wing in Gr.III and their promotions were ordered as per the seniority-cum-suitability on each side separately basing on the vacancies arising from time to time. It is relevant to point out that the occurrence of vacancies will differ basing on retirements, deaths, resignation, promotions to selection posts etc. It is not possible to fix that a Fitter should get promotion to next grade after so many years or on par with other categories. As per the above, Electrical Fitter with less service may be getting promotion to higher grade than Mechanical Fitter with a longer years of service as their seniority units are different. This cannot be stated as injustice as contended by the applicants.

7) In reply to para 6(5), it is true that Headquarters Personnel Branch, Secunderabad vide their letter No.P(EL)/694/Sangh/63/Sub. No.14 of 23-10-1991 have dispensed with taking options while promoting the staff from Khalasis in scale Rs.750-940 to the

grade of Khalasi Helpers in scale Rs.800-1150. As already pointed out, the above staff come under Group 'D' category and they assist the Fitters in Gr.III and above in their day-to-day working. Obtaining their willingness to the Electrical and Mechanical wings is still exists while filling the vacancies of Group 'C' cadre of Fitters Gr.III as and when vacancies arise in each wing.

Hence, there is no change of category of work is group 'D' staff that is being carried out by the staff in the wings of Electrical and Mechanical. The above has nothing to do with the promotion of Fitters Gr.III to higher grades as contended by the applicants. As already stated above, the ratio of the staff cannot be changed from 60:40 to 50:50 just with a view to give more promotions to Mechanical staff, as that will upset the working needs and lead to wastage of staff on Mechanical side and shortage of staff on electrical side thus effecting the very working of the Loco Shed. Incidentally, it is submitted that the avenue is not for giving promotions that the shed is erected but to get the maintenance of the Locos. However, it is ensured that the principle of equity is not jeopardised by stipulating set percentage of higher grade posts to avoid any frustration, ^{said} cause a sence of deprivation. The workload of the Mechanical wing has not been increased as contended by the applicants. It is not based on any technical data but only hypothetical at best.

8) In reply to para 6(6). The applicants cannot compare the sanctioned strength of Loco Shed/BZA which deals with steam loco motives and there are no Electrical Fitters in the Loco Shed. The Loco Shed engages in the work connected to the steam Engines. As the Honourable Court is aware the Electrical locos

are replacing the steam locos and quoting the Steam loco shed has no relevance. Moreover, the main contention of the applicants is the comparison of promotional prospects of staff of Mechanical with that of Electrical wing in ELS/BZA.

Hence, the strength of Mechanical staff in the Steam Loco Shed cannot be compared. As already stated above, the recruitment of staff under the various categories of Electrical, Mechanical and Artisan wings will be always according to the working needs of Electrical Loco Shed, but it will not be viewed for any individual promotions of a category.

9) In reply to para 6(7), As already stated above, the revised policy of promoting Group 'D' staff from Khalasi to Khalasi Helpers cannot be implemented in Group 'C' category as per the workload basing on job requirements. It is imperative in the interest of achieving high degree of performance expected by Railways that the work of the staff is to be bifurcated into Mechanical and Electrical wings with a view to achieve the benefits of Division of Labour staff of bettering their career is well protected by the twin principle of avenue of promotion in consultation with Organised Labour and stipulated percentage distribution of posts in various grade in the same trade.

10) In reply to Para 6(8). As the quantum of work as a whole in the Electrical Loco Shed is increased and posts are also increased simultaneously as per yard stick in both Mechanical and Electrical wings and there is no need to alter the ratio of 60:40 as the work of the Mechanical wing has not been increased to alter the ratio of 60:40.

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11) In reply to para 6(9). as above stated the vacancies of higher grades of Fitters/Gr.II and Gr.I will be filled as and when arises. Notification has been issued for alerting the staff for suitability test for both the wings of Electrical and Mechanical wings. The No. of vacancies are as follows:-

Electrical Fitters/Gr.I	..	17
-do- /Gr.II	..	38
Fitters(RS) Grade.I	..	8
Fitters(RS) Grade.II	..	28

There is no need to stop the suitability test since there is no need to alter the ratios of the Electrical and Mechanical wings as contended by the applicants. As a matter of fact stopping the trade tests will jeopardise the maintenance of locos which will have direct adverse impact on the movement of the transport of men and materials of the Vijayawada Division.

In view of the facts stated above, there are absolutely no merits in the application O.A.No.87/92 and it is liable to be dismissed. I pray that the Honourable Tribunal may be pleased to dismiss the same with costs and pass such other orders as this Honourable Tribunal may deem fit and proper in the circumstances of the case.

Shri Venkat Rao for Shri M.Srinivas requests for adjournment on the ground that Shri M.Srinivas is out of station. The OA reached hearing yesterday. There was no leave note filed by Shri M.Srinivas nor any one appeared for him to ask for adjournment. The matter being an old matter of the year 1992 we were inclined to dispose it of after going through the record of the case. However at the request of Shri Sanaka Rama Krishna Rao and Shri CV Malla Reddy that they will inform Shri M.Srinivas to attend to the matter we adjourned the matter till today. However instead of Shri M.Srinivas remaining present or any other learned advocate placed in charge of the matter, Shri M.Venkat Rao seeks adjournment. Having regard to the long pendency of the matter we refuse adjournment. Shri Venkat Rao says that he has no instructions. Hence we have gone through the record and heard Standing counsel for the Respondents. We proceed to dispose of the OA acting under Rule 15(1) of CAT (Proceedure) Rules, 1987.

2. The application was originally filed seeking a declaration that the respective applicants are entitled for promotion as Fitters Grade III to Grade II and Grade II to Grade I on the basis of their relative seniority on par with the persons from the Electrical Wing and consequential relief. However by order dt.5-6-92 the applicants were directed to restrict the prayer only to Gr.III Fitters amongst the applicants and to amend the OA accordingly. The counsel for the applicants has thereafter amended the OA confining it to the 25 applicants who are working as Gr.III Fitters Mechanical Wing and has retained the names of only 25 applicants. The application is therefore confined to those 25 applicants. The applicants (25 in number) had been working as Fitters Traction Rolling Stock Department,

Electric Loco Shed, S.C.Rlys, at Vijayawada. The said Electric Loco Shed was started in the year 1979. It has two wings viz., Mechanical and Electrical. The applicants were working at various places earlier as Khalasis and Khalasi Helpers. Subsequently they were appointed as Fitters. The category of Fitters is divided into three grades viz., Gr.III, Gr.II and Gr.I. Khalasi Helpers fall within Gr.III Fitters. The applicants have been placed in that grade. The appointment of Gr.III Fitters is done in both the Wings viz., Electrical & Mechanical after the choice is indicated by the employee concerned to be placed either in Electrical Wing or in Mechanical Wing. These appointments are made after issuance of a notification calling for options and then by holding a written test. It is averred that all the applicants are Fitters working in the Mechanical Wing. Their grievance is that although those persons who were given appointment in the Electrical Wing are being promoted to Gr.II Fitters and Gr.I Fitters and are getting promotion much before the Mechanical Staff the Mechanical Staff in category-III is being left behind. This anomaly according to the applicants arises because the respondents are following the ratio of 60:40 for the Mechanical Wing as against the ratio of 50:50 followed in the Electrical Wing. The applicants allege that therefore the respondents are practicing discrimination between similar employees working in the two wings and there is breach of rule of equality.

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The applicants therefore seek the declaration as mentioned at the out set. It is also their contention that work load in the Mechanical Wing in Vijayawada Loco Shed ^{has} increased ^{of} late with the introduction of latest type ~~of~~ Locomotives and therefore the stand of the respondents that there is more work in the Electrical Wing than the Mechanical Wing is erroneous and ⁱⁿ results /arbitrary treatment being meted out to the Mechanical Staff. The O.A. was presented in August, 1992.

3. The question therefore that needs consideration is as to whether the respondents are justified in adopting the ratio of promotion as 60:40 for Mechanical Wing instead of 50:50 in the Electrical Wing. No other disputed question has been raised.

4. The respondents have in their reply offered following explanation in justification of following the ratio of 60:40 for the Mechanical Wing :

The Electrical Loco Shed comes under Traction Rolling Stock Department and the staff employed in the Railway are programmed to progress by having a scheme of distribution of posts in different grades at a particular percentage and an avenue. This avenue is finalised by the Administration in consultation with the representatives of the Organised Labour (through the 2 recognised Trade Unions) at the zonal level at the Headquarters of the S.C. Railway. It is as per the existing avenue chart that there exist two wings viz., Mechanical Wing and Electrical Wing. That Division has been made to provide the Administration requisite quantitative and qualitative staff to the intake of skilled grade. In both the wings however the vacancies of Fitters are filled by promotion (50%) from Khalasi Helpers, 25% by Limited Departmental Competitive Examination quota from serving Khalasis and Khalasi Helpers and 25% by direct recruitment. The applicants came in the cadre of Fitters Gr.III by direct recruitment in the year 1979-80 at the

initial stage of formation of Electrical Loco Shed. Some of the applicants have been promoted as Khalasi Helper and some from LDCE quota. At the time of appointment as Gr.III Fitters the candidates have choice to choose by exercising the wing in which they are interested and after passing the necessary Trade Test they are appointed as Mechanical and Electrical Fitters as per their choice. The applicants were appointed in this manner in the Mechanical Wing. Fitters are eligible for promotion in both wings to Gr.II and Gr.I. As per the working needs of the Electrical Loco Sheds the posts created for the Mechanical Wing are less than the Electrical Wing and therefore they are maintained in the ratio of 60:40. Due to this the posts in the higher grades of Fitter Gr.II and Gr.I in the Mechanical Wing are less compared to the Grades of I and II in the Electrical Wing numerically but percentage is same and thus the rule of equality is not breached. From Fitter Gr.III the channels are bifurcated into two branches as Mechanical and Electrical Fitters will progress to II and I basing on their suitability and availability of the vacancies. The seniority of the employees belonging to allied trades is clubbed with the Mechanical Fitters for the purpose of promotion and the seniors among them will be promoted to Gr.II as per the combined seniority after passing the necessary test. The respondents therefore contend that the applicants cannot compare themselves with that of the employees of the Electrical Wing with regard to their promotion since the number of posts as well as employees are more in the Electrical Wing than that of the Mechanical Wing and the promotions in the Electrical Wing will be more than in the Mechanical Wing. The posts in the higher grade are proportionately more in the Electrical Wing because the posts are bifurcated as Gr.II and I and the seniority of the staff is separately maintained for the Electrical and Mechanical Wing in Gr.III and their promotions were ordered as per the seniority.

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✓ cum suitability on each side separately basing
on the vacancies arising from time to time. The
occurrence of vacancies will differ in two wings.
It is not possible to fix that a Fitter would get
promotion to next grade after a certain number of
years or on par with other categories and thus
the Electrical Fitter may get promotion earlier
✓ than a Mechanical Fitter with a longer years of
as their seniority units are different. The Res-
✓ pondents denied that the work load of Mechanical
wing has increased as averred by the applicants and
they contend that the averment is not based on any
technical data but is hypothetical. The respondents
✓ also pointed out that the quantum of work as a whole
in the Electrical Loco Shed has increased and posts
are also increased simultaneously in both the wings
✓ and there is therefore no need to ^{change} ~~challenge~~ the
ratio of 60:40 for the Mechanical Wing. The Respon-
dents state that the vacancies of the Fitters
Gr. II and I will be filled as and when need arises.
They however also state that there is no need to
stop the suitability test since there is no need
to alter the ratio. The reply was made in 1992
and therefore the respondents have mentioned the
✓ vacancies as they were available ^{then} in the respec-
tive wings. The respondents thus contend that
the contention of the applicant, that in compari-
✓ sion the promotional prospects of the Mechanical
staff have ~~not~~ been affected or thus the respon-
dents are acting arbitrarily or that it results
in discrimination vis-a-vis the applicants is
wrong.

5. The reply of the respondents gives a fair idea of the
scheme adopted. There cannot be a dispute in view of the aver-
ments made in the application itself that when the staff from
Khalasi and Khalasi Helper is brought to Fitter Gr. III an option
was earlier being taken for opting for either Mechanical Wing
or Electrical Wing. Although it appears from the reply that after
23-10-91 taking of options ^{for promotion} / has been dispensed with ^{but} in so far as the
✓ applicants ^{are} concerned it is clear that they had gone to the Mechanical

Wing as per their choice. Now it also appears from the counter that the Railway Board has issued a direction to the effect that distribution of posts be made into Skilled Gr.III, Skilled Gr.II and Skilled Gr.I in the ratio of 30:35:35 respectively. With that distribution it is clear that the ratio is maintained in all the 3 grades and it is by virtue of working needs that the number of posts are more in the Electrical Wing. The promotion being regulated as per the distribution of posts the opportunities of promotion are equal in both the wings depending upon the availability of vacancies. That also can be seen from the posts that were available when the counter was filed that is in 1992. It is shown in para-11 that there were 17 vacancies in the Fitter Gr.I and 38 vacancies in the Fitter Gr.II in the Electrical Wing and there were 8 vacancies in the Fitters Gr.I and 28 vacancies in Fitters Gr.II the last two being in the Mechanical Wing. Bearing in mind this vacancy position the ratio of 60:50 applied to Mechanical Wing does not appear to be unfair or unjust.

6. The ratio is applied right from the initial stage viz., when promotions are effected from unskilled staff to Semi Skilled staff and then Semi-skilled to Skilled category and for that purpose the method of departmental competitive examination is followed. Once the two wings are bifurcated and seniority is separately maintained the avenue of promotion would have to be accepted as is available in the respective wings by the staff working in the respective wings. Staff in one wing cannot compare itself with the staff in the other or with the prospects as may be open to the staff in the other wing. No grievance in that respect can be made after initially the choice is made to opt

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
for mechanical wing. We therefore do not find discriminatory treatment meted out to some class of employees. The employees working in Mechanical Wing are a separate class and the employees working in the Electrical Wing are a separate class. Although the source of initial recruitment may be similar the difference in prospects of promotion to the higher grades is regulated by the exigencies governing the two wings from time to time and availability of vacancies in the two wings. It may be emphasised that the applicants had been given choice when they were brought to Fitters Gr.III and they had opted for Mechanical Wing. The prospect of promotion in electrical wing also cannot be said to be preferential to the Electrical Staff because there are more number of persons to be considered by reason of larger number of posts. The applicants therefore cannot seek comparison with the staff in Electrical Wing.


7. We are also inclined to accept the statement of the respondents that with the increase in the quantum of the work as a whole in the Electrical Shed, posts have been increased simultaneously in both the wings so the prospects of the Mechanical Wing have not been adversely affected. The division of the posts is being made as per the working needs of the shed and we do not find that the respondents who are in charge of the shed have carried out the division inconsistently with the working needs of the shed. We are also inclined to accept the statement made by the respondents that the work load of the Mechanical Wing has not increased with reference to the quantum of work required to be put in by the staff of the Mechanical Wing. The further circumstance of both the labour unions having agreed to the avenue of promotion as provided

and the percentage and ratio followed further shows that the respondents have not acted unfairly. This is not a case where it can be said that the legitimate expectation of reasonable opportunity of promotion to higher grades is denied to the applicants. As explained by the respondents the vacancies when they arise are filled up after issuance of notification and inviting candidates to apply and thereafter by holding a suitability test. These are the normal and basic rules by which a recruitment would be governed and we see nothing unfair in that procedure being followed by the respondents.

8. In the light of the above discussion we are of the view that no case of discrimination or unequal treatment has been disclosed. Likewise no case has been established to alter the ratio being followed by the respondents in the two wings. In view of this conclusion no relief as prayed can be granted to the applicants. Accordingly the case is liable to be dismissed.


9. The OA is dismissed. No costs. The interim order stands vacated.
