In the instant case, Railways have prepared a waiting list of the candidates awaiting appointment in Group-C in Rangiya Division. In Annexure-A/5 the respondents have stated</p>

30.5.2006 that there are 46 clerical vacancies to be filled up in all departments including the Accounts Department. According to the applicants, waiting list was prepared as per seniority of the candidates. Mr. P.K. Tiwari, learned counsel for the applicants submits that the applicants are mainly aggrieved in not following the seniority as per Annexure-A/3 while making Group-C appointment, rather pick and choose method has been adopted by the respondents.

SYNOPSIS

The applicants are Group-D staff of NF Railway, who were appointed on compassionate ground. These applicants were initially enlisted for appointment in Group-C categories on compassionate ground but were offered provisional appointment in Group-D due to lack of suitable vacancy in Group-C at the relevant point of time. As per the circulars of Railway Board, if a candidate for appointment is found suitable for Group-C but accommodated in Group-D for want of a vacancy in Group-C, such a candidate will have a preference to be appointed against the vacancy in Group-C as and when such vacancy arises. In the present case, the Railway authorities prepared a waiting list of candidates awaiting appointment in Group-C in Rangia Division (Annexure-A/3). However, from Annexure-A/3 waiting list, in a pick and choose manner candidates were appointed to Group-C in violation of serial order. Perusal of the documents show that the Railway authority only appointed graduate Group-D staff against those vacancies in Group-C for which the minimum qualification is matriculation. By impugned Annexure-A/5 the railway authorities are going to fill up yet another 46 vacancies in Group-C by graduate Group-D staff who are waiting to be appointed in Group-C, even though, for those vacancies the minimum qualification is matriculation. Hence the present application.

DETAILS OF APPLICATION

1. PARTICULAR OF THE ORDER AGAINST WHICH THE APPLICATION IS MADE

The present application is not directed against any specific order but the same is against the arbitrary action of Railway authorities in appointing some of the Group-D staff (who were appointed on compassionate ground) to Group-C in a pick and choose manner in violation of seniority principle.

2. JURISDICTION OF THE TRIBUNAL :

The applicants further declare that the subject matter of the instant application is well within the jurisdiction of the Hon'ble Tribunal.

3. LIMITATION :

The applicants further declare that the application is within the limitation period prescribed under Section 21 of the Administrative Tribunals Act, 1985.

4. FACTS OF THE CASE :

4.1 That the applicants before this Hon'ble Tribunal are Group-D staff of NF Railway. They have a common grievance arising out of a common cause of action. The reliefs which the applicants are seeking, are also common. Hence, applicants may be given the liberty to file the instant application jointly in terms of Rule 4 (5) (a) of the CAT Procedure Rules, 1987.

4.2. That the applicants were enlisted for appointment in Group-C on compassionate ground, but were offered provisional appointment in Group-D due to lack of suitable vacancies in Group-C at the relevant point of time.

The copy of the appointment letters of some of these applicants are annexed herewith and marked as Annexure - A/1.

4.3 That there was a Railway Board circular No. E(NG) II-84/RCI/Policy dated 31.3.84 SE 79/84, according to which if a candidate for appointment is found suitable for Group C but accommodated in Group-D post for want of a vacancy in Group-C, specific remark should be kept on record that such appointment in Group-D is being made as the candidate needs employment immediately for non-availability of a post in Group-C. Such a candidate will have preference, to be fixed in a vacancy in Group-C, occurring later over a candidate (in the same priority group) found suitable on a subsequent date under the same approving authority.

4.4 That all the present applicants as stated above were appointed on compassionate ground. At the time of initial appointment, they were found suitable for Group-C and they had requisite qualification for Group-C. Since vacancies were not available in Group-C these applicants were accommodated in Group-D and remark was made on record that the appointment of these applicants were made in Group-D as they needed employment immediately. The statement to the aforesaid effect was also made in the appointment letters of these applicants.

4.5 That the Divisional Railway Manager (P), Alipurduar Junction issued a circular dated 25/30 April 2003, wherein it was stated that many candidates registered for appointment in Group C categories on compassionate ground were offered provisional appointment in Group-D due to lack of suitable vacancies in Group-C. It was also stated that those appointed provisionally in Group-D will retain their right to be appointed in Group-C as and when suitable vacancies arise.

Copy of circular dated 25/30 April 2003 issued by the Divisional Railway Manager (P), Alipurduar Junction is annexed herewith and marked as Annexure - A/2.

4.6 That in terms of aforesaid circular, the NF Railway authorities prepared a statement of wait listed candidates awaiting appointment in Group-C vacancies in Rangia Division. In the Statement, the names of the candidates working as Group-D staff but waiting for appointment in Group-C were given serially in terms of their seniority.

Copy of the statement of wait listed candidates awaiting appointment in Group-C in Rangia Division is annexed herewith and marked as Annexure - A/3.

4.7 That the NF Railway authorities were expected to adhere to the seniority principle while appointing wait listed Group-D staff to Group-C. However, the Group-D staff from Annexure-A/3 list were appointed to Group-C in a pick and choose manner without adhering to the seniority principle. From Annexure-A/3 list the Group-D staff from serial No. 10, 19, 39, 40, 42, 49, 52, 69, 71, 72, 78, 79, 80, 85, 87 and 89 were appointed to

Group-C. In this connection the NF Railway authorities prepared the list of those Group-D staff who were empanelled for Group-C post.

Copy of the list of Group-D staff empanelled for Group-C is annexed herewith and marked as Annexure A/4

4.8 That from Annexure-A/3 list those very Group-D staff were empanelled for Group-C who are graduates. However, the Group-C vacancies against which these Group-D staff were appointed do not have graduation as minimum qualification. Instead the minimum qualification for these posts is matriculate. Since all the applicants have the qualification of Higher Secondary, therefore, all of them were eligible to be appointed against those very Group-C posts. Hence, simply because of the fact that the Group-D staff who were appointed to Group-C posts, were graduates, does not constitute them into one homogenous Group having a rational basis for preferring them over the other senior Group-D staff for the purpose of appointment to Group-C.

4.9 That in Group-C there are three different scales viz.-Rs. 3050-4590, Rs. 4500-7000/- and Rs. 7450-11,500/-. The minimum qualification for appointment to the scale of Rs. 3050-4590/- is matriculation. All the persons named in Annexure-A/4 list are graduates who were appointed from Group-D to Group-C in the scale of Rs. 3050-4590/-. Therefore, it is evident that the graduate Group-D staff were preferred over other senior Group-D staff for appointment to those very posts in Group-C, the minimum qualification of which was matriculation.

4.10 That from the office of General Manager (P), NF Railway, letter dated 25.2.2006 was issued to Divisional Railway Manager, NF Railway, Rangia Division for filling up 46 clerical vacancies in Rangia Division. It was clearly mentioned in the letter that for filling up the aforesaid vacancies the suitable wait listed Group-D staff who are graduates are to be considered and that 16 graduates who are already available in the waiting list and graduates who are to be selected in future are also to be appointed.

Copy of the letter dated 25.2.2006 issued from the General Manager (P) is annexed herewith and marked as Annexure-A/5.

4.11 That the 46 vacancies which are sought to be filled up as per the letter dated 25.2.2006, the minimum qualification of graduation is necessary only in the case of vacancies in the Accounts Department. Except the vacancies in the Accounts Department for all other vacancies the minimum qualification is matriculation. Hence, the decision of the NF Railway administration to appoint only those Group-D staff to Group-C who have the qualification of graduation, is unfair and illegal. There is no reasonable basis for appointing only the graduates from amongst the Group-D staff to those Group-C vacancies for which the minimum qualification is matriculation and for which the other Group-D staff who are in the waiting list for appointment to Group-C, are eligible.

4.12 That the past action of the NF Railway authorities to appoint only graduates amongst the wait listed Group-D staff to Group-C and the impugned decision conveyed by letter dated 25.2.2006 is violative of the applicant's

fundamental rights under Article 14 and 16 of the Constitution of India inasmuch as the wait listed Group-D staff who are qualified to be appointed to Group-C cannot be discriminated against without any rational or intelligible basis for the purpose of appointment to those vacancies in Group-C for which the minimum qualification is matriculation. Hence, there is no basis for preferring graduate Group-D staff over undergraduate Group-D staff for appointment to those very vacancies for which the minimum qualification is only matriculation and for which both the graduates and undergraduate Group-D staff are eligible.

4.13 That till the filing of this application, the process of selection for filling up the 46 vacancies in Rangia Division in terms of the letter dated 25.2.2006 had not yet begun. Hence the present case is a fit case wherein this Hon'ble Tribunal may be pleased to stay the operation and effect of the Annexure-A/5 letter dated 25.2.2006.

4.14 That the applicants file this application bonafide for securing the ends of justice.

5. GROUND FOR RELIEF WITH LEGAL PROVISIONS:

5.1 Because in the matter of appointment to those very vacancies in Group-C for which the minimum qualification is matriculation, there cannot be any discrimination between the Group-D staff on the ground of being graduate or non-graduate especially when all such Group-D staff have the minimum qualification of matriculation making them eligible for such appointment.

5.2 Because the impugned decision conveyed in the letter dated 25.2.2006 is violative of fundamental rights under Article 14 and 16 of the Constitution of India as it gives preference to graduates over non-graduates for appointment against those vacancies for which the minimum qualification is only matriculation.

5.3 Because there has to be rational basis in giving preference to one set of Group-D staff over another set of Group-D staff for the purpose of making appointment from Group-D to Group-C. The NF Railway authorities failed to follow any rational principle in conformity with the Article 14 and 16 of the Constitution of India for appointing only graduate Group-D staff to those very vacancies in Group-C for which the minimum qualification is only matriculation.

6. **DETAILS OF REMEDIES EXHAUSTED:**

That the applicants state that they have no other alternative efficacious remedy except by way of approaching this Hon'ble Tribunal.

7. **MATTERS NOT PREVIOUSLY FILED OR PENDING BEFORE ANY OTHER COURT:**

The applicants further declare that they have not filed any application, writ petition or suit regarding the matter in respect of which this application has been made before any Court, Authority or any other Bench of the Hon'ble Tribunal nor any such application, writ petition or suit is pending before any of them.

8. RELIEFS SOUGHT FOR:

8.1. Quash and set aside the letter dated 25.2.2006 issued by the office of the General Manager (P), NF Railway, Maligaon, Guwahati-11.

8.2 Direct the respondents not to discriminate between the graduate and non-graduate wait listed Group-D staff for making appointments against those vacancies of Group-C for which the minimum qualification is matriculation.

8.3 Direct the respondents to appoint Group-D staff to those vacancies of Group-C for which the minimum qualification is matriculation, from Annexure-A/3 list of Group-D staff in serial order.

8.4 Pass such other order or orders as this Hon'ble Tribunal may deem fit and proper in the facts and circumstances of the case.

9. INTERIM ORDER PRAYED FOR:

Pending disposal of the application be further pleased to stay the operation and effect the letter dated 25.2.2006 issued from the office of the General Manager (P), NF railway, Maligaon, Guwahati-11 and/or not to

make any further appointment from Annexure-A/3 list.



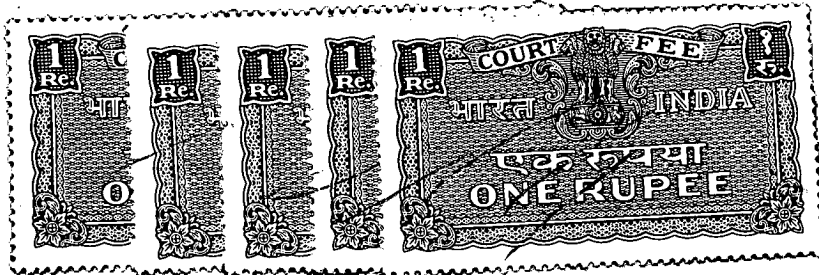

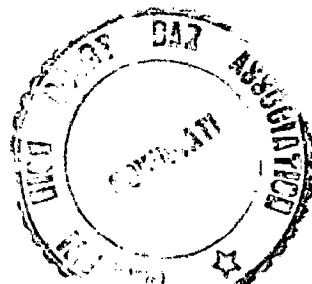

Written statement on behalf of respondents.

The answering respondents respectfully SHEWETH:

1. That they have gone through the copy of the application filed and have understood the contents thereof. Save and except the statements which have been specifically admitted hereinbelow or those which have been borne on records all other averments/allegations made in the application are hereby emphatically denied and the applicant is put to the strictest proof thereof.

2. That for the sake of brevity meticulous denial of each and every allegation/statement made in the application has been avoided. However, the answering respondents have confined their replies to those allegations/averments of the applicants which are found relevant for enabling the Hon'ble Tribunal to take a proper decision on the matter.

3. That the application suffers from non-joinder of necessary parties and is therefore not maintainable in law. Annexure A-3 to the O.A. (Page 20) contains names of 108 persons similarly situated and yet most of them have not been made party to the O.A. Similarly Annexure A-4 contains names of 18+6 persons none of whom has been made party to the O.A. On this ground of non-joinder the application is flawed in the eye of law.

4. That the application suffers from want of a valid cause of action. The applicants are well aware that their appointment on compassionate ground was provisional and while their claim for appointment in Group C post is on the records, their claim is subject to consideration of qualification, fitness and suitability and the overall service requirements of the administration and their training profile and skills acquired in course of service as Group D staff. As a general rule graduates are preferred for clerical

jobs in the present context due to their potential for supervisory jobs in future and because they can be better moulded for greater responsibilities after imparting the required training in areas such as computers, human resource development and multi-disciplinary skills. It is therefore necessary that compassionate appointees who joined in Group D category have to wait their turn for vacancies to occur in categories where they fit in vis-a-vis their educational profile, skills and suitability.

In view of these considerations the applicants do not have a cause of action and therefore the application merits dismissal.

5. Parawise comments:

5.1. That as regards paragraph 4.1, the respondents have no remarks to offer as the matter relates to a decision by the Hon'ble Tribunal on the records of the case.

5.2. That as regards paragraph 4.2, the respondents beg to state that Annexure A-1 to the O.A. is not an appointment letter but is only an offer letter to the addressees and it was upto the respective candidates to exercise the choice of acceptance. The offer made was to render relief to the members of the family of the deceased staff and is proof of the earnest of the respondents to fulfil their sense of compassion.

5.3. That in regards to paragraph 4.3, respondents beg to state that Railway Board's letter dated 31.03.84 mentioned that actual appointment to Group C posts, when a vacancy arises at a later date, would be subject to the person concerned being considered suitable in all respects at the time of actual appointment.

5.4. That in regards to paragraph 4.4, respondents submit that the correct position has not been stated by the applicants. The applicants were considered for appointment in Group C service on compassionate ground as per their claimed academic qualifications. This did not mean that they were fit for any Group C post in the Railways. Candidates who had requisite qualification for appointment against technical categories like Electrical Fitter, Technical/Gr III have been appointed in Group C category where they were found fit for the posts in a need based manner. Basically, it was a question of suitable vacancies required to run the administration and if the persons awaiting appointment from Group D (on compassionate ground) were not fit for Group C jobs they had necessarily to wait.

5.5. That as regards paragraph 4.5, respondents beg to state that the letter dated 25/30-4-2003 issued

by the Divisional Railway Manager, Alipurduar Junction clarifies the position of promotees from Group D compassionate appointees to Group C jobs, inter alia stating that "chances of locating suitable vacancies in Group 'C' are very limited". The respondents stand by the contents of the said communication as there is no controversy about the policy indicated therein.

5.6. That as regards paragraph 4.6, the respondents have no remarks to offer except to state that the statement submitted as Annexure A/3 is nothing but a periodical update of the waitlisted candidates for appointment in Group C.

5.7. That as regards paragraph 4.7, the respondents beg to state that the contention of the applicants is not correct. It is submitted that appointment of applicants on compassionate ground is made subject to their being found suitable for various kinds of jobs. This applies to both Group D as well to Group C categories. While suitability is the prime consideration, the principle of seniority based on the date of application or the date of acceptance or the date of expiry of the deceased as the case may be is also kept in mind to ensure equity and justice within a group listed on the basis of suitability. For example, if there are jobs in the clerical cadre, graduates would be preferred, especially if it is found that they can be trained and moulded for multi-disciplinary utilisation in the work of the administration. Within these candidates, commerce graduates would be preferred for clerical cadre of the Accounts department. In such a situation it is but natural that non-graduates of the waiting list in question would have to wait their turn for occurrence of suitable vacancies after the list of graduates is exhausted. It is humbly submitted here that implementation of such a policy justly and fairly implemented does not hurt anyone, while at the same time helping the administration to improve efficiency through better service to the customers.

5.8. That in regard to paragraph 4.8, the respondents beg to state that the statement of the applicants is based on a wrong perspective. It is always the intention of the administration to get the best out of the pool of talent available with them in course of recruitment to various posts. As has been indicated in paragraph 5.7 above, it is rational to select graduates for clerical cadre for reasons stated therein. The matter would have been different if suitable graduates were ignored, which is not what is stated by applicants in the O.A.

5.9. That with regards paragraph 4.9 respondents beg to state that there are different categories of posts in Group C railway service and technical/educational qualifications are different for different jobs. For example if a diploma holder in Civil/Electrical/Mechanical is available among the waitlisted candidates of Group D compassionate candidates, they would be offered job in ~~Group D~~ Group C in preference to others who have no such qualification. Similarly graduates in commerce would be preferred for Accounts clerks for reasons stated in paragraph 5.7 above. The question of minimum qualification is not at all relevant under the circumstances.

5.10. That as regards paragraph 4.10, respondents beg to state that in order to streamline the administrative set up in the interest of economy, a policy has been set in motion whereby certain posts are filled up only on a need based manner. In certain cases, the decision about what vacancies are to be filled up and what allowed to lapse is taken at the highest level of the head of the department and finally cleared by the General Manager personally. It is thus that the General Manager's approval is required for filling up vacancies of office clerks as the same is a diminishing category replaced by a cadre of multi-disciplinary workers capable of doing multiple functions after proper training. It was in following this policy that the direction was issued through the letter referred to by the applicants in Annexure A-5 of the O.A.

In this connection it is also clarified that at the time of starting operation of the new Railway Division at Rangiya recently, 46 clerks were temporarily drafted from Alipurduar Junction Division from which the new Division of Rangiya was carved out. As per agreement with organised labour and as per directive of Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Calcutta in OA 593-597/05, these 46 clerks of Alipurduar Junction Division are to be repatriated to Alipurduar Division. It was therefore necessary to fill up these expected vacancies by issue of the directive referred to. It is here submitted that the selection of graduates for filling up these posts without any discrimination is not meant to hurt the prospects of any/else and was therefore perfectly in order as the purpose was to ~~serve~~ serve public interest by streamlining administration.

5.11. That in regards to paragraphs 4.11 and 4.12,

respondents beg to state that the allegation of the applicants that the decision of the respondents violates the fundamental rights of the applicants is wrong and based on a fundamental misconception and is therefore meant to mislead the Hon'ble Tribunal. It is clear that the applicants did not come to join the service through the normal course of recruitment but on compassionate consideration of charity to death in harness employees. In their case the normal rules of recruitment did not apply. They had volunteered for Group D posts on a choice given to them. Their future appointment in Group C posts is subject to their being found fit for posts for which vacancies arose from time to time.

In this connection it is submitted that the office work of the newly created Rangiya Division has been modernised through large-scale use of computers and other time-saving devices. Records are being streamlined so that information is available on the push of a button instead of going through bulky files etc. For this reason sufficient skill and aptitude is required for office works. The competent authority considered the cases of the applicants also in a dispassionate manner and found them unsuitable for office work based on their educational background. The decision of the respondents in this matter therefore cannot be called into question. Moreover, it is submitted that their names have been kept in the list of eligibility for suitable Group C posts as and when suitable vacancies arose. Therefore, the action taken by the respondents is fair and legal.

5.9. That in regard to paragraph 4.13 respondents beg to inform that out of 46 vacancies allowed to be filled up 23 (17 graduates and 6 medically decategorised staff) were issued offer letters of appointment and out of these 13 graduates and 6 medically decategorised staff have joined duty before 30.05.2006. This position is submitted in view of the unjust and untenable request of the applicants for a stay which has no justification in view of the position submitted above.

Under the circumstances, respondents beg to state the application under consideration has no cause of action and may therefore be dismissed with costs.

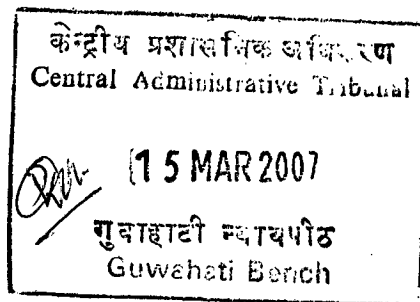

ADDITIONAL STATEMENT OF FACTS BY THE APPLICANT.

I, Hemandri Guha Neogi aged about 34 years, son of Late M.N. Guha Neogi c/o R.B. Das, Railway Quarter No. 120-B, BG Colony, New Bongaigaon, do hereby solemnly affirm and state as follows:-

1. That I am the applicant no.1 in O.A. No. 120/2006. The aforesaid Original Application was filed before this Hon'ble Tribunal for redressal of common grievances of 5 numbers of Group-D staff who were appointed in NF Railway on compassionate grounds. The case made out in the Original Application was that the applicants were initially enlisted for appointment in Group-C category on compassionate ground but were offered provisional appointment in Group-D due to lack of suitable vacancy in Group-C at the relevant point of time. As per the circular of Railway Board, if a candidate for appointment is found suitable for Group-C but accommodated in Group-D for want of vacancy in Group-C,

such a candidate will have preference for appointment against the vacancy in Group-C as and when such vacancy arises. In the present case, the Railway authorities prepared a waiting list of candidates in Rangia Division awaiting appointment in Group-C, (Annexure-A/3). However, from Annexure-A/3 waiting list, in a pick and choose manner candidates were appointed to Group-C in violation of serial order. Perusal of the documents show that the Railway authority only appointed graduate Group-D staff against those vacancies in Group-C for which minimum qualification is matriculation. By impugned Annexure-A/5, the Railway authorities were going to fill up yet another 46 vacancies in Group-C by graduate Group-D staff, who were waiting to be appointed in Group-C, even though for those vacancies the minimum qualification is matriculation. Being thus aggrieved OA No. 120/06 was filed for appropriate relief.

2. That the Hon'ble Tribunal on 30.5.06, issued notice to the respondents and in the interim directed that the filling up of 46 vacancies as per Annexure-A/5 if not already done, will be subject to the outcome of the Original Application. However, in course of deliberation before the Hon'ble Tribunal, questions were raised as to the basis and criteria for preparation of Annexure-A/3 wait listed candidates awaiting appointment in Group-C category in Rangia Division. The questions were also raised as to whether the list in question is in serial order and if yes than what is the basis for such a serial order. A question

was also raised as to whether a serial order of wait listed candidates as shown in Annexure-A/3 list is to be scrupulously followed in making appointment to Group-C category and if yes then what are the guiding principles in such a case.

3. That during the pendency of the Original Application, the applicant could get the copy of the master circular of the Railway coupled with a relevant document which throws significant light on the questions which had arisen in course of deliberations before this Hon'ble Tribunal.

4. That in order to place on records the relevant materials and documents with regard to the facts in issue, the instant Additional Statement of Facts is being filed before the Hon'ble Tribunal.

5. That there are master circulars of the Government of India, Ministry of Railway, Railway Board, dealing with priorities to be observed in making appointments on compassionate ground. In this connection reference is made to the circular no. E(NG) II/84/RC-1/51 dated 19.9.1984 and circular no. E(NG) III/78/RC-1/1 dated 7.4.1983, which deal with the priorities to be observed in making appointment on compassionate grounds. The relevant portion from the aforesaid circulars taken from the compilation of Master Circulars on Reservation, Jobs, Recruitment for Physically

Handicapped Group 'C' & 'D' posts etc., is quoted herein below:-

PRIORITIES TO BE OBSERVED IN MAKING APPOINTMENT ON
COMPASSIONATE GROUNDS.

a) The following should be the order of priority to be followed while making appointments on compassionate grounds:-

i) Dependents of employees who die or are permanently crippled in the course of duty.

ii) Dependents of employees who die in harness as a result of Railway or other accidents when off duty.

iii) Dependents of employees who:-

a) die in service or are totally incapacitated while in service irrespective of the period of service left to reach the age of superannuation or of earning retirement benefits in full, or

b) are medically decategorised with less than 30 years of qualifying service for pensionary benefits/30 years of service for SC to PF.

iv) dependents of employees who are medically decategorised with 30 years or more of qualifying

service for pensionary benefits/30 years of service for SC to PF. (NO.E(NG)II/84/RC-1/51 dated 19.9.1984).

b) For the proper enforcement of priorities, separate lists should be maintained in each office, for the categories indicated above, the date of priority being from the date of eligibility. All appointments should be made strictly in this order. Where, for any special reasons, it is felt necessary to depart from the priority list, the sanction of the next higher authority (Chief Personnel Officer for appointments to Group 'C' posts) must be obtained giving details for ignoring the priority and the list of persons being put back in priority list. Such cases should, however, be rare.

c) Where a candidate for compassionate appointment is eligible and is also adjudged suitable for a post of Group-C but for want of a vacancy in Group-C, he is offered appointment in Group-D, which he accepts; his case may be considered for in a Group-C post as soon as suitable vacancy arises therein. Such a candidate will have preference for appointment in a vacancy in Group-C occurring later, over a candidate in the same priority group, found suitable for such

NGW

a post at any subsequent date under the same approving authority. In such cases, a specific record, with the approval of the competent authority should be kept to the effect that the candidate was selected for a Group-C post but appointed to a Group-D post for want of a vacancy in Group-C because the candidate needs employment immediately and that he will be considered for a vacancy in Group-C as early as possible when a vacancy arises therein subject to his being found medically fit for the post for which he is considered.

(No. E(NG)III/78/RC-1/1 dated 7.4.1983).

6. That perusal of the circulars dated 19.9.1984 and 7.4.1983 show that the order of priority is to be followed when making appointment on compassionate grounds. The dependents of employees who died or are permanently crippled in the course of duty are given the first priority in making appointment on compassionate grounds. The priority which is followed in making appointment on compassionate grounds is also adhered to, while preparing list of those Group-D staff who are awaiting appointment in Group-C vacancies in terms of the circulars of the Railway.

7. That the factum of preparation of the list of Group-D staff empanelled for Group-C on the basis of priority in

u/gw

terms of the circulars of the Railway is borne out from perusal of the list of Group-D staff of Rangia Division who were appointed on compassionate grounds. The aforesaid list was forwarded by the Divisional Railway Manager, Alipurduar to the Divisional Personal Officer N.F Railway, Rangia Division, vide letter dated 19.1.04. By the aforesaid letter dated 19.1.04 the Divisional Railway Manager furnished details of 43 docket cases of Group-C empanelled employees. The list of Group-D staff empanelled for Group-C which was forwarded by letter dated 19.1.04, shows that the same was prepared on priority basis in terms of the requirements of circulars in force. In the list, Group-D staff from serial no. 1 to 4 belongs to the first priority group being the dependents of employees who expired or were permanently crippled in the course of duty. Except the employees from serial no. 1 to 4, the rest of the Group-C empanelled employees being similarly situated in their case the date of the death of the Railway employees has been followed as a criterion for determination of seniority of Group-D staff empanelled for Group-C post.

Copy of the letter dated 19.1.04 of Divisional Railway Manager along with the list enclosed therewith is annexed herewith and marked as **ANNEXURE-A/6.**

8. That if the aforesaid list is treated to be correct then it is apparent that the applicants were superseded by the person junior to them while making appointments to the

Group-C post from the list of Group-D staff empanelled for Group-C.

That the statements made in the additional statement of facts in para 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 8 are true to my knowledge and those made in para 7 being matter of records is true to my information derived therefrom, which I believe to be true and the rests are my humble submissions before this Hon'ble Tribunal.

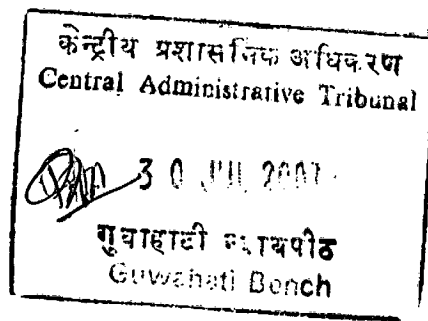

SECOND ADDITIONAL STATEMENT OF FACTS BY THE
APPLICANTS.

I, Hemadri Guha Neogi aged about 34 years, son of Late M.N. Guha Neogi, C/O R.B.Das, Railway Quarter No.120-B, BG Colony, New Bongaigaon, do hereby solemnly affirm and state as follows:-

1. That I am the applicant No.1 in the O.A.No.120/2006. On 14.3.07, the applicants had filed the additional statement of facts in the pending original application narrating the developments that had taken place during the pendency of the present application. However, after the filing of the additional statement of facts by the applicants on 14.3.07, there were certain other important developments which have come to the notice of the applicants. In the facts and circumstances of the case, these developments are required to be brought on record for the proper and effective adjudication of the issues involved in the present application. Hence,

for bringing these new developments on record, the second additional statement of facts is being filed by the applicants. The Hon'ble Tribunal may be pleased to grant leave to the applicants to file the second additional statement of facts in the present original application.

2. That the office of the Divisional Railway Manager(P), Ranqiya vide office order No.T/254/RM(E) Pt-I(D to C)/Selection dated 19.10.06 filled up the 46 clerical vacancies in all departments including accounts department by the wait listed compassionate ground candidates awaiting appointment in Group-C. Out of 46 at least 16 appointments were made in violation of the seniority principle. The applicant No.1 was also covered by the office order dated 19.10.06 and from Group-D he was appointed in a vacancy of clerk in Group-C.

Copy of the office order dated 19.10.06 is annexed herewith and marked as ANNEXUREA/7.

3. That after the appointment of applicant No.1 to Group-C post by the office order dated 19.10.06, his personal grievance has been satisfied. However, since the applicant belongs to the group of original five applicants who had filed the present original application, the applicant on behalf of the remaining applicants is filing the present additional statement of facts bringing these new developments on record.

4. That the Railway authorities had prepared a waiting list of candidates awaiting appointment in Group-C (Annexure-A/3). The aforesaid Annexure-A/3 waiting list was made from those Group-C candidates who were appointed to Group-D on compassionate ground, even though at the time of their appointment on compassionate ground, they were eligible for appointment in Group-C, but due to non-availability of vacancy in GROUP-C they were given appointment in Group-D.

5. That in the facts and circumstances of the case, it is necessary to mention that those candidates including the present applicants who were appointed on compassionate ground in Group-D had in fact cleared the requisite test for appointment in Group-C. Since at the relevant point of time, vacancies in Group-C were not available, therefore, these candidates including the present applicants were appointed in Group-D. Hence discrimination thereafter between graduate and non-graduate eligible Group-D staff for adjustment in Group-C is without any basis.

6. That by the office order dated 19.10.06, amongst the names of Group-D employees awaiting appointment to Group-C, there were 16 numbers of Group-D employees who were appointed in violation of the seniority principle against the 46 clerical vacancies from the waiting list of Group-D employees. The details of 16 numbers of Group-D employees who were appointed in

Group-C in violation of the principle of seniority are given herein below:-

1. Nag Sankar Jha- Accounts Clerk, Accounts Department, Rangiya Division.

2. Vishnu Kumar- Offered appointment as Enquiry Cum Reservation Clerk but not yet turned up.

3. Sanjay Gurung- recommended for the post of stenographer pending General Manager's kind approval.

4. Miss Sumita Barman- Junior Clerk/Establishment, Rangiya Division.

5. Rajib Chatterjee- Junior Clerk/Establishment, Rangiya Division.

6. Pankaj Deb- Recommended for the post of stenographer pending General Manager's kind approval.

7. Ullam Kar- Junior Clerk/Establishment, Rangiya Division.

8. Ashis Baishya- Accounts Clerk, Accounts Department, Rangiya Division.

9. Karna Baishya- Junior Clerk/Establishment, Rangiya Division.

10. Lakheswar Muchahary- Recommended for the post of stenographer pending General Manager's kind approval.

7. That the Hon'ble Tribunal on 30.5.06 issued notice to the respondents and in the interim directed that the filling up of 46 vacancies as per Annexure-A/5 if not already done, will be subject to the outcome of the original application. Hence, in view of the order made by the Hon'ble Tribunal in its order dated 30.5.06, the adjustment of above names of 16 numbers of Group-D employees to Group-C is not legally sustainable and the same is liable to be quashed and set aside.

8. That the statements made in the additional statement of facts in para 1,3,4,5,6 and 7 are true to my knowledge and those made in para 2 being matter of records is true to my information derived therefrom, which I believe to be true and the rests are my humble submissions before this Hon'ble Tribunal.
